*Moribana* (literally “piled up flowers”) is the hallmark of the Ohara School. It was developed by the First Headmaster Unshin Ohara at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The concept was revolutionary; flowers were arranged across a plane in a low bowl container called *suiban*, in contrast to the centuries-old tradition of placing flowers at a single point. Learn about the different *Moribana* styles of the Ohara School and enjoy creating your own arrangement in a *suiban*.
